FEATURES

The skunk cabbage is a perennial herb. It has no stems. The smooth leaves, which may be up to two and one-half feet long and nearly one foot wide, are produced after flowering. The flowers are located close to the ground on a thickened structure that is surrounded by a purple to green sheath. The fruits are berries.

BEHAVIORS

The skunk cabbage grows in fens and other areas with springs. This plant flowers from March through May.
