FEATURES

The flowers of tall alumroot are bell-shaped. They hang down from small stems on a long, flowering stalk. The petals are generally green but may show some red. Flowering stalks may reach two to three feet in height. The leaves are basal and have an appearance somewhat like maple tree leaves.

BEHAVIORS

Tall alumroot may be found in the southern two-thirds of Illinois as well as in Cook and Jo Daviess counties. It grows in dry woodlands. Flowers are produced in May and June.
