FEATURES

The wild blue iris is a perennial herb with a thick underground stem. Its leaves are smooth and may be three feet long and one and one-half inches wide. Blue flowers are borne at the tips of the stems. Flowers may be three inches across. Capsules containing the seeds are up to four inches long.

BEHAVIORS

The wild blue iris grows in swamps, wet meadows, marshes, pond borders and ditches. This plant flowers from May through June.
