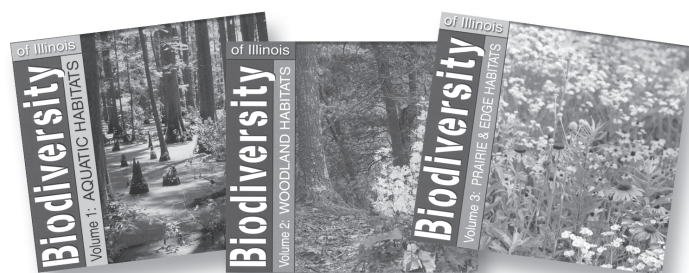


Resources

Grants

Taking your students outdoors for learning can be beneficial in many ways and reinforce classroom lessons. Two grants from the IDNR can help. The *Schoolyard Habitat Action Grant* program provides up to \$1,000.00 per teacher for development or enhancement of wildlife habitat on the school grounds or other public place. The *Illinois Biodiversity Field Trip Grant* program offers grants of up to \$500.00 per teacher to take students on a field trip to study Illinois' natural heritage.
