## PREFACE

The Illinois Endangered Species Protection Act, originally enacted in August 1972 and revised in July 1986 and January 2000, requires that the Illinois Endangered Species Protection Board prepare and make available a report of its accomplishments biennially. An initial report was prepared and made available for the period July 1986 - June 1988. Biennial reports were not prepared for the biennia that ended in 1990, 1992, 1994, 1996, 1998, and 2000. A report prepared and made available by Board members covered the period July 2000 – June 2002 and included highlights from the previously unreported biennia. In July 2002, the Board’s budget was reduced and then eliminated due to funding shortages in the State of Illinois and, as a result, Board staff was laid off. Until November 2008, the Board functioned with only part-time or no staff. In spring 2009, the Board’s newly hired full-time staff person, an Executive Director, completed a report for the period July 2006 – June 2008 that included highlights for the periods July 2002 – June 2004 and July 2004 - June 2006. The Executive Director subsequently prepared reports for the biennia ending in 2010, 2012, and 2014. In September 2015 the Board was informed that its funding had again been eliminated, resulting in the loss of staff. The Board Chair, with assistance from the Illinois Department of Natural Resources, prepared a report for the period July 2014 – June 2016. The Chair and Board member Evans produced and submitted a report for the biennium ending in 2018. The last six biennial reports are posted on the Board’s website ([www2.illinois.gov/dnr/ESPB](http://www2.illinois.gov/dnr/ESPB)). The current report, prepared by the Board Chair, with input from the other Board members, covers the biennium July 2018 – June 2020.

## **INTRODUCTION**

The Illinois Endangered Species Protection Board (Board/ESPB) was created by the Illinois Endangered Species Protection Act in 1972. The publication “The Illinois Endangered Species Protection Act at Forty: A Review of the Act’s Provisions and the Illinois List of Endangered and Threatened Species” presents a history of the Board and is available on the Board’s website ([www2.illinois.gov/dnr/ESPB](http://www2.illinois.gov/dnr/ESPB)).

Statute requires that the Board biennially prepare and make available a report of its accomplishments. This report, prepared by the Board Chair, with the assistance of the other Board members, covers activities during two fiscal years – July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2020.

### **STATUTORY MANDATES AND RESPONSIBILITIES PERTAINING TO THE ILLINOIS ENDANGERED SPECIES PROTECTION BOARD**

That the Endangered Species Protection Board exist (520 ILCS 10/6);

That the Board maintain and update the List of Illinois Endangered and Threatened Species (Illinois List/List) as warranted and no less often than every five years (520 ILCS 10/7);

That the Board hold a public hearing when making revisions to the Illinois List (520 ILCS 10/7);

That the Board advise the Illinois Department of Natural Resources (Department/IDNR) on methods of assistance, protection, conservation, and management of endangered and threatened species and their habitats, and on related matters (520 ILCS 10/6);

That the Board hold meetings no less often than quarterly (520 ILCS 10/6);

That the Board produce a report of accomplishments, biennially (520 ILCS 10/6);

That the Department seek the advice of the Board as it plans and implements a program for the conservation of endangered and threatened species (520 ILCS 10/11);

That the Department shall consult with and gain written approval from the Board when promulgating rules for the issuance and maintenance of endangered and threatened species permits (520 ILCS 10/4); and

That the Department seek the advice of the Board and provide written response to any Board comments regarding the issuance and terms of authorization for incidental taking of endangered and threatened species (17 Ill. Adm. Code 1080.40 (a)(7)).

## **COMPOSITION OF THE BOARD**

The Board is composed of nine members appointed by the Governor, with the Director of the IDNR (or the Director's designee) serving as a nonvoting member. By statute at least six of the appointed Board members must be "recognized as naturalists by training, avocation, or vocation" and the membership must include at least two zoologists, one botanist, and two ecologists. Board members are appointed for a term of three years and continue to serve until replaced. All Board members complete online Open Meetings Act training. They receive no compensation other than actual travel expenses. During the 2018 - 2020 biennium Board members donated more than 1130 hours of their time to the State.

The Board functions with three elected Executive Officers: Chair, Vice-chair, and Secretary. At the 183<sup>rd</sup> meeting in August 2019, Dr. Joyce Hofmann was elected Chair, Dr. Janice Coons Vice-Chair, and Dr. Tracy Evans Secretary.

## **BOARD STAFF**

Since September 2015 the Board has had no staff due to the elimination of its funding by the Governor's Office. Board members have been performing tasks necessary to comply with the Board's legal mandates. Department personnel have provided valuable assistance to the Board, especially Office of Resource Conservation Director Chris Young. Lisa Bulinski and Kristi Sorenson provided administrative services, while Marni English and Emily Brodt, an intern with the Department, updated the Board's website during the biennium. Jeannie Barnes of the Illinois Natural History Survey supplied the Board's Endangered Species Technical Advisory Committees (ESTACs) with records from the Illinois Natural Heritage Database during the revision of the Illinois List of Endangered and Threatened Species. Without Board staff, however, it has not been possible to meet some of the Board's responsibilities as fully as in previous times or to conduct discretionary activities that would further the protection and conservation of Illinois' endangered and threatened species.

## **QUARTERLY MEETINGS**

The Board convened seven regularly scheduled quarterly meetings during the biennium. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the 186<sup>th</sup> meeting scheduled for May 15, 2020 was postponed until August 2020. Meetings were conducted in compliance with the Open Meetings Act (OMA) and a quorum was present for all meetings. Board meetings had previously been held at various locations throughout Illinois, but all meetings during the biennium took place at the Midewin National Tallgrass Prairie Visitor Center in Wilmington. This has been a central location for Board members and has reduced travel costs. Agendas and minutes for all Board meetings are posted on the Board's website.

### **BIENNIAL REPORT**

A biennial report for July 2016 – June 2018 was prepared by Chair Hofmann and Board member Evans and approved by the Board at its 178<sup>th</sup> meeting in May 2018. The report was posted on the Board’s website and sent to the State Library, the Governor’s Office of Management and Budget, and the General Assembly Legislative Research Unit. The present report covering the period July 1, 2018 – June 30, 2020 was approved by the Board at the 187<sup>th</sup> meeting on October 9, 2020.

### **ILLINOIS LIST OF ENDANGERED AND THREATENED SPECIES**

During the 2018 – 2020 biennium the Board worked to finish its review and revision of the Illinois List of Endangered and Threatened Species (Illinois List/List), the current List having become effective on May 15, 2015. The Board had established Endangered Species Technical Advisory Committees (ESTACs) composed of experts in specific taxonomic groups (mammals, birds, amphibians and reptiles, fish, invertebrates, and plants) to assist with the review and revision of the Illinois List. The ESTACs function is to review records from the Department’s Illinois Natural Heritage Database and other scientific data to assess the current status of listed species and make recommendations to the Board for any changes. The committees may also recommend placing additional species on the Illinois List. All ESTAC members completed OMA training and committee meetings complied with the Act. The zoological ESTACs each met once during the 2016 - 2018 biennium.

Because of the large number of plants listed as endangered and threatened in Illinois, the Plant ESTAC held three regional meetings. The first regional meeting took place at the Illinois Natural History Survey in Champaign on May 25, 2018 to discuss the plants of central and western Illinois. On August 24, 2018 the ESTAC met at the Midewin National Tallgrass Prairie Visitor Center in Wilmington and reviewed the plants of northern Illinois. Plants of southern Illinois were reviewed when the ESTAC met at the Shawnee National Forest office in Harrisburg on November 9, 2018. The ESTAC held an additional meeting on February 6, 2019 at the Illinois Natural History Survey to finalize its recommendations. Members of the Plant ESTAC are listed in Appendix 1.

At its 179<sup>th</sup> meeting in August 2018 the Board gave preliminary approval to a petition to change the status of the Bigeye Chub (*Hybopsis ambiops*) from endangered to threatened.

At its 180<sup>th</sup> meeting in November 2018 the Board gave preliminary approval to petitions for the following changes to the Illinois List:

- change the status of the Redspotted Sunfish (*Lepomis miniatus*) from endangered to threatened
- add the Mottled Sculpin (*Cottus bairdii*) to the List as threatened
- add the Ozark Minnow (*Notropis nubilus*) to the List as threatened
- change the status of the Downy Solomon's Seal (*Polygonatum pubescens*) from threatened to endangered

At its 181<sup>st</sup> meeting in February 2019 the Board gave preliminary approval to petitions to change the status of the Prairie Buttercup (*Ranunculus rhomboideus*) from threatened to endangered and add the Butternut (*Juglans cinerea*) to the List as endangered. The Board preliminarily approved taxonomic changes for three listed reptiles and two typographical errors in the 2015 Illinois List were noted for correction.

At its 182<sup>nd</sup> meeting in May 2019 the Board gave preliminary approval to petitions for the following changes to the Illinois List:

- remove Fibrous-rooted Sedge (*Carex communis*) from the List
- remove Mountain Clematis (*Clematis occidentalis*) from the List
- remove Beaked Hazelnut (*Corylus cornuta*) from the List
- add the Spring Cavefish (*Forbesichthys agassizii*) to the List as threatened
- add Harvey's Buttercup (*Ranunculus harveyii*) to the List as threatened
- add Cluster Fescue (*Festuca paradoxa*) to the List as threatened
- add White-edge Sedge (*Carex debilis*) to the List as endangered
- add Hickey's Groundpine (*Dendrolycopodium hickeyi*) to the List as endangered
- change the status of Pitcher's Thistle (*Cirsium pitcheri*) from threatened to endangered
- change the status of Tamarack (*Larix laricina*) from threatened to endangered
- change the status of Hill Prairie Larkspur (*Delphinium carolinianum*) from threatened to endangered
- change the status of Narrow-leaved Sunflower (*Helianthus angustifolius*) from threatened to endangered
- change the status of Old Plainsman (*Hymenopappus scabiosaeus*) from threatened to endangered

The Board almost gave preliminary approval to taxonomic changes for several listed plant species that need to be incorporated into the revised List.

At its 183<sup>rd</sup> meeting the Board approved a list of additional changes to the scientific nomenclature of listed species and voted to give the Chair the authority to correct any typographical errors found in the 2015 Illinois List. The Board gave preliminary approval to petitions seeking the following changes to the Illinois List:

- change Banded Killifish (*Fundulus diaphanus*) to Western Banded Killifish (*Fundulus diaphanus menona*)
- add Opaque Oval Sedge (*Carex opaca*) to the Illinois List as endangered

add Eastern Straw Sedge (*Carex straminea*) to the Illinois List as endangered  
add White Bergamot (*Monarda clinopodia*) to the Illinois List as threatened  
add Cat's Claw (*Mimosa nuttallii*) to the Illinois List as endangered  
change the status of Virginia Bunchflower (*Melanthium virginicum*) from threatened to endangered

change the status of Leafy Bulrush (*Scirpus polyphyllus*) from threatened to endangered  
The Board also voted to change the Illinois status of the wolf (*Canis lupus*) from threatened to endangered to match its federal status. The Board then confirmed all of its preliminary listing decisions for the revision of the Illinois List.

A public hearing on the Board's proposed changes was held on October 11, 2019 (see the following section).

At its 184<sup>th</sup> meeting in November 2019 the Board considered comments from the public and confirmed its final list of proposed changes to the Illinois List.

The Chair and Dr. Bridget Henning, IDNR, prepared amended Administration Rules containing the Illinois List of Endangered and Threatened Fauna (17 Ill. Adm. Code 1010; Appendix 2) and the Illinois List of Endangered and Threatened Flora (17 Ill. Adm. Code 1050; Appendix 3). The amended Administrative Rules were submitted to the Department in December 2019 for review by legal counsel and approval by the Director.

The amended Administrative Rules were published in the Illinois Register (First Notice) on February 21, 2020. The Department responded to public comments received following First Notice and prepared Second Notice documents on behalf of the Board.

The Joint Committee on Administrative Rules gave approval to the amended Administrative Rules at its meeting on May 20, 2020 and the Rules became effective on May 28, 2020 (Appendix 2). The 2020 List includes 486 species (36 fish, nine amphibians, 18 reptiles, 29 birds, eight mammals, 53 invertebrates, and 333 plants). A 2020 checklist of Illinois endangered and threatened species is posted on the Board's website. The 2015 checklist and a summary of changes during the 2020 revision are also available on the website.

## **PUBLIC HEARING**

A public hearing on the proposed changes to the Illinois List of Endangered and Threatened Species was held at the Illinois Department of Natural Resources building in Springfield on October 11, 2019. Dr. Tracy Evans served as the hearing officer. There were no comments from the public during the meeting. The comment period remained open for two weeks and four written comments were received. The Board responded to all comments.

## **ADDITIONAL ACTIVITIES DURING THE BIENNIUM**

The Board held a special joint meeting with the Illinois Nature Preserves Commission in Springfield on January 21, 2020. Department staff gave presentations on topics of



interest to the Board and Commission at the meeting.

Chair Hofmann attended the 230<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Illinois Nature Preserves Commission in Cypress on September 11, 2018; the Commission's 231<sup>st</sup> meeting in Springfield on January 29, 2019; and its 234<sup>th</sup> meeting in Springfield on January 22, 2020. Board member Schietzelt represented the Board at the Commission's 232<sup>nd</sup> meeting in Crystal Lake on May 14, 2019. Board member Capparella attended the Commission's 233<sup>rd</sup> meeting in Mattoon on September 10, 2019 as the Board's representative. A report on Board activities was prepared for all Commission meetings during the biennium.

Board members Coons and Fant attended meetings of the Botanical ESTAC to act as facilitators and record minutes.

All Board members completed mandatory Illinois Ethics and Sexual Harassment Prevention training during 2018 and 2019.

As required by statute, the Department continued to submit draft Incidental Take Authorizations (ITAs) to the Board for its advice. Since the Board had no staff to review these draft ITAs, individual Board members provided the Department with comments on some of these documents.

#### **Section 1010.25 Criteria Used for Listing**

- a) A species shall be included on the Official List when one or more of the following criteria exist:
- 1) Species or subspecies designated as federally endangered or threatened.
  - 2) Species proposed for Federal Endangered or Threatened status that occurs in Illinois.
  - 3) Species that formerly were widespread in Illinois but have been nearly extirpated from the State due to habitat destruction, collecting, or other pressures resulting from the development of Illinois.
  - 4) Species that exhibit very restricted geographic ranges of which Illinois is a part.
  - 5) Species that exhibit restricted habitats or low populations in Illinois.
  - 6) Species that are significant disjuncts in Illinois, i.e., the Illinois population is far removed from the rest of the species' range.
- b) A species will be removed from the Official List if it no longer fulfills one or more of the criteria in subsection (a), except for a species that no longer fulfills the criteria because it no longer inhabits Illinois. The determination will be made pursuant to Section 7 of the Endangered Species Protection Act [520 ILCS 10/7].

### **Section 1010.30 List**

All federally designated endangered or threatened animal species and subspecies have been automatically listed as endangered or threatened under the Illinois Endangered Species Protection Act and placed on the Illinois List by the Board and are protected under the Act even though their names do not appear in this Section. Only those federally designated endangered or threatened animal species and subspecies known to occur in Illinois are designated as Illinois-endangered or Illinois-threatened by the Board and their names appear in this Section. ## Section 1050.25 Criteria Used For Listing

- a) A species shall be included on the Official List when one or more of the following criteria exists:
- 1) Species or subspecies designated as federally endangered or threatened.
  - 2) Species proposed for Federal Endangered or Threatened status that occur in Illinois.
  - 3) Species that formerly were widespread in Illinois but have been nearly extirpated from the State due to habitat destruction, collecting, or other pressures resulting from the development of Illinois.
  - 4) Species that exhibit very restricted geographic ranges of which Illinois is a part.
  - 5) Species that exhibit restricted habitats or low populations in Illinois.
  - 6) Species that are significant disjuncts in Illinois, i.e., the Illinois population is far removed from the rest of the species' range.
- b) A species will be removed from the Official List if it no longer fulfills one or more of the criteria in subsection (a), except for a species that no longer fulfills the criteria because it no longer grows in Illinois. The determination will be made pursuant to Section 7 of the Endangered Species Protection Act [520 ILCS 10/7].
