The area has been seeded for a second year, the interpretive trail has been sown with buffalo grass, and several interpretive signs erected. A kiosk has also been completed and is ready for placement as soon as the parking lot is in place.

At this time, I am asking for reimbursement for seed, signs, herbicide, trail cover (buffalo grass) and kiosk expenses up to the \$3,000 maximum which are detailed in the WPF grant #01-L09W.

WILDLIFE PRESERVATION FUND FY 01 LARGE PROJECT PROPOSAL

PROJECT TITLE: Development of the Illinois Audubon Prairie Preserve in Jasper County, Il.

JUSTIFICATION: The loss of grasslands, especially native prairies, and the subsequent decline of grassland wildlife throughout Illinois has been well documented. In an effort to restore and also develop an appreciation for grassland communities in Illinois, the Illinois Audubon Society, a not-for-profit 501(c) 3 organization, recently purchased 80 acres of cropland adjacent to Prairie Ridge State Natural Area in Jasper County. The Society plans to utilize 40 acres of this site to provide both grassland habitat and an opportunity for environmental education in this region of Illinois. The remaining 40 acres will also be restored to grasses.

OBJECTIVE: Develop a self-guided interpretive hiking trail on tallgrass prairie preserve in southeastern Illinois. The tract will be restored to a native prairie community composed of both grasses and wildflowers. This area will provide critical habitat for the grassland species that utilize Prairie Ridge State Natural Area. Shallow water wetlands will also be restored on the tract to provide breeding, foraging and migratory habitats for amphibians, reptiles, marsh birds and waterfowl.

A number of signs will be placed along the hiking trail to provide visitors with a self-guided, interpretive trail. The signs will give visitors an opportunity to learn about the importance of natural grassland and wetland communities, threatened and endangered species, and a variety of species of birds, mammals, amphibians, reptiles, butterflies and other insects, as well as native plants. Visitors will be able to walk the trail at their leisure, learning about native prairie and wetland communities. This will allow them the opportunity to develop an understanding and appreciation of the importance of these rare ecosystems and their associated wildlife species.

The interpretive trail will be maintained by site staff from Prairie Ridge State Natural Area, through a cooperative agreement with I.A.S. Staff and volunteers from the I.A.S. will design, develop and assist with the management of the trail. Local conservation, environmental, youth and volunteer groups will also assist with the trail. There are no other self-guided interpretive trails in this region of Illinois. There is a tremendous demand for this type of interpretive area by local school groups, resource managers, conservation and environmental groups, educators and visitors to Prairie Ridge State Natural Area.

The trail will be approximately one mile long and six feet wide. It will be a combination of wood chips and native grasses. A parking lot will be constructed at the trail head, which will provide parking for up to six vehicles and will be large enough to be utilized by a school bus.

A trail head sign will be placed at the parking lot to provide visitors with information on the prairie preserve, including rules and regulations for its use. Brochures will be available for the self-guided interpretive trail. A viewing platform will be constructed at the shallow water wetlands to provide visitors an opportunity to observe wildlife.

This interpretive trail provides educators, resource managers, students and the general public an opportunity to learn the importance of grassland communities and their associated species. This is an excellent opportunity to restore and promote the importance of these natural communities, while at the same time developing an appreciation for them.

REGARDING YOUR LETTERING

Your vehicle has been thoroughly washed and the lettered areas have been degreased and stripped of wax. High quality lettering enamel or vinyl has been used for the lettering. Every precaution has been taken in its application to insure maximum adhesion.

Excess chalk and layout marks can (and should) be removed with a soft wet cloth after the paint is dry to the touch. Lettering can be washed with bucket and sponge after two weeks. (During winter months, three to four weeks may be required due to colder temperatures.)

Although it can't hurt, hand waxing is not required to preserve the lettering. (Allow four weeks before waxing.) The paint becomes extremely hard when mature, insuring you years of effective and inexpensive advertising.

Note: Automatic car washes and high pressure hoses can be damaging to enamel.
