**Introduction**

Sugar Grove Nature Center in Funks Grove Illinois opened in October 2004. The development of the Nature Center was made possible by the establishment of Sugar Grove Foundation, a non-profit 501(c)3 organization. The acquisition of environmental education resources is essential to the development of a quality environmental education program and facility. The Nature Center is located in Funks Grove. This high-quality natural area contains 5 dedicated Illinois Nature Preserves and has been designated as a National Natural Landmark by the U.S. Department of the Interior. Due to the amazing diversity of plants and animals, including several threatened and endangered species, the desire to develop a non-game wildlife education component is at the top of the list in our EE strategic plan.

**Materials & Methods**

A variety of resources have been acquired in order to develop several components that will enable education for preschool, elementary, middle and high school students as well as scouts and youth groups, and adult, family, and senior audiences in on and off-site presentations throughout the year. Items include preserved specimens, study skins, skulls, pelts, and other natural history items, replicas, species specific study materials, videos, DVDs, CD-Roms, books, field guides, puppets, and posters. All items were obtained legally from reputable nature/science retailers and from IDNR field biologists.

After acquiring materials, we began the development of education programs, a rotational visitor center display, and a brochure on the non-game fauna of Funks Grove. SGNC hosted a teacher in-service for the entire staff of Heyworth Grade School, to promote the education services available from the Center, including a variety of non-game topics.

Nature Center Director, Angela Smith, conducted a program on the "Owls of Illinois" on January 10, 2005 (public attendance 55). Joe Kath, IDNR Endangered Species Program Manager conducted a "Bats of Illinois" program on June 7, 2005 (public attendance 47). Materials acquired through the Wildlife Preservation Fund grant were used in both presentations and the WPF was recognized at both programs for its support. In addition, the Sugar Grove Nature Center will be offering a Winter Wilderness Camp on December 29 & 30, that will include education on winter survival of non-game wildlife. **Summary**

Funding from the Wildlife Preservation Fund has enable the Sugar Grove Nature Center to develop high-quality environmental education programs and products. A complete herp survey will be completed by Illinois State University, a bat survey will be completed by Joe Kath (IDNR), and a bird survey will be conducted by the local Audubon club which will then be used to complete the informational brochure and display. In the meantime, the education resources have enabled us to reach hundreds of individuals regarding the diversity of Illinois non-game wildlife, the threats that they face, and what can be done to protect them.

**Expenses**

All Sugar Grove Nature Center staff time was contributed as an in-kind expense to the grant to allow the maximum benefit of the grant to be realized. \$1,000 from the IWPF along with funds in excess of \$1,000 from Sugar Grove Nature Center enabled the purchase of materials and resources that will be used for years to come to educate about Illinois' Non-Game Wildlife.
