**Grant Agreement #11-R01W Final Report
Security and Safety (padlock and freezer replacement)**
Submitted by Jane Seitz, Executive Director
May 11, 2011

Project Objective:

Replacement Padlocks to provide security for our wildlife patients and our educational residents and to keep any invited, trespassers or unwanted guests from entering cages and harming themselves or the occupant.

Replacement Freezer to provide proper storage for food (mice and quail) that is fed to our wildlife patients and our educational residents. And to protect the nearly \$1,500.00 worth of food that is on hand at any given time at the center.

Completed Project Description

Padlocks: Forty-two locks were purchased from Decatur Lock Company at total costs of \$799.68. The lock company put the IRC logo on each lock free of charge. They are also repairing any old locks that can be repaired for extras and keying them like the new ones - all at no charge. The IRC now has good locks on every cage and building door that opens with one key. The new locks have made feeding and caring for our wildlife patients quicker and easier. And the staff feels much safer with the new locks in place.

Freezer: IRC had requested \$900.00 for a freezer when applying for the grant. The IRC ended up purchasing a similar appliance from Lowe's in Decatur – but with not quite as many bells and whistles – for only \$599.00 with an additional 10% off. The total was \$539.10. That was a \$360.90 difference. I e-mailed Lamma Parrack, the Grant Administrator, and received permission to use the remaining money for the purchase of an additional freezer to give even more space. I have attached a copy of that email. It is so nice to have clean and reliable appliances in service. The purchases from Lowe's were \$539.10 on March 20th and \$390.00 on April 19th. The total of the receipts is \$929.10. The IRC will pick up the additional \$29.10 from our operating budget.

Total reimbursement requested is $\$799.68 + \$900.00 = \$1699.68$


The Illinois Raptor Center received a grant entitled "Security and Safety (padlocks and freezer replacement)" from the Illinois Wildlife Preservation Fund (#11-R01W). We are very thankful for the grant. The IRC has the new locks purchased, delivered and on the cages. They are great!

The IRC is also grateful to have received the grant for a new freezer and it was just in time. The old freezer finally died after a long, slow death and there has been nowhere to start storing raptor food for the upcoming baby season. We are very, very thankful for the grant.

I do have a question. I requested \$900.00 for a freezer when I applied for the grant. The IRC ended up purchasing a freezer at Lowe's in Decatur that was similar - but with not quite as many bells and whistles - for only \$599.00 with an additional 10% off. The total was \$539.10. That is a \$360.90 difference. Would the grant allow for the purchase of a smaller freezer or refrigerator/freezer with the remaining money? The IRC could really use the additional storage. I didn't think it would hurt to ask.

Layman Art Gallery Exhibit Features Drew Tucker's "Lincoln is Bigger Than Me"

An exhibit of works by Illinois-based artist Drew Tucker will be on view at the Layman Art Gallery on the campus of Lincoln College in Lincoln through April 16. The show titled "Lincoln is Bigger Than Me" is free and open to the public.

Tucker is best known for his watercolor images, created over the past decade, which illustrate murky worlds and the figures that live in them. He has created commissioned works for a variety of well-known game companies, and he is prolific in a variety of media: bookmaking, photography, 3-D constructions and furniture design.

Tucker works in a variety of mediums and often combines such techniques as collage, watercolor, and mixed media. He describes his work as "intuitive and based upon thinking, reading and research."

An accomplished artist, Tucker's client lists includes The Riverfront Times, The Rocket, The Duclist, Fonix, Hasbro, Aetherco Games, Black Entertainment, The Southern Illinoisian, Nightlife, White Wolf Game Studios, Core Apparel, TOP Cards, APE Games, Wizards of the Coast, TSR, Five Rings Publishing, Slave Labor Comics, Moonstone Comics, and Iron Crown Enterprises.

When asked about significance of this exhibit, adjunct professor Christopher Tice said, "Drew has a whimsical and dark aspect to his works that draws you in. His work is based on research and his own take on the subject matter. He likes to create a new mythology based around the research in an attempt to shed some new insight, either true or fictional, on the subject. The current exhibit is based around the life and mythology of Abraham Lincoln, which makes it extremely relevant to our College."

Drew Tucker is an Instructor of Art at John A. Logan College, Carterville,

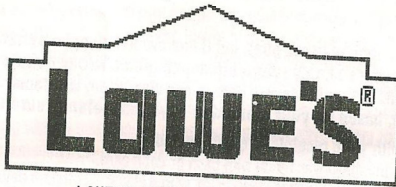
